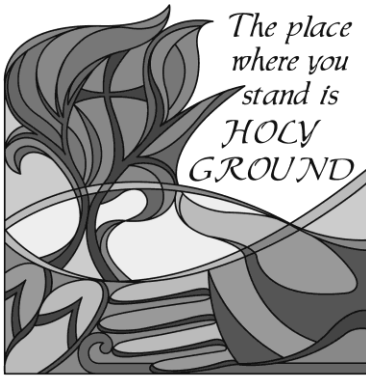
Third Sunday of Lent March 6-7, 2010

Merciful and gracious is the Lord, slow to anger and abounding in kindness. — *Psalm 103:8*

THE MYSTERIOUS ONE

Last Sunday we gathered with Peter, John, and James at the mountain of Transfiguration and were summoned to listen to God's chosen Son. This week the scriptures draw us into the mystery of just who that God is. The first reading, perhaps one of the best known in the Bible, recounts the story of Moses and the burning bush, when the mysterious divine name is revealed. The responsorial psalm is a hymn extolling the attributes of God. Saint Paul and the Lord Jesus describe a God who judges and metes out punishment. No matter the lengths to which the scriptures go, we know that no amount of words will ever come close to capturing who God is. Our lives and our Lenten journeys are really journeys toward that mysterious One who will one day welcome us into the heavenly home that awaits those who put their trust in God alone.

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — The LORD God appears to Moses and directs him to go and deliver the Israelites from Egypt (Exodus 3:1-8a, 13-15) or *Exodus 17:3-7*.

Psalm — The Lord is kind and merciful (Psalm 103) or *Psalm 95*.

Second Reading — We are not to grumble like the people with Moses in the desert (1 Corinthians 10:1-6, 10-12) or *Romans 5:1-2, 5-8*.

Gospel — If you do not repent, you will all perish (Luke 13:1-9) or *John 4:5-42 [5-15, 19b-26, 39a, 40-42]*.

SAINT FRANCES OF ROME (1384-1440) March 9

Nature and human nature—plagues and wars—turned late medieval Rome into a living hell, particularly for the sick and poor. Frances, by birth and marriage well provided for, was a devoted wife and mother; but like Benedictine Oblates who, to this day, “pray and work” while living with their families and working in the world, she joined like-minded laywomen friends in ministering to society's most vulnerable. Frances' charity was not only “hands on” but “in home.” Her palace becoming a hospital after the plague claimed two of her three children. When her husband's death ended their loving marriage of forty years, Frances joined other widowed Oblates in community. In an interesting link to the United States, our nation's premier religious congregation for women of color, the Oblate Sisters of Providence, in 1833 established bonds of spiritual communion with these “Oblates of Saint Frances” in Rome. 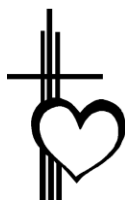

BISHOP Mc CORMACK TO HOST DIOCESAN PILGRIMAGE TO ROME FOR CANONIZATION OF BROTHER ANDRE BESSETTE

Bishop John B. McCormack is inviting New Hampshire Catholics to join him on a pilgrimage to Rome and other Italian holy sites from October 15-25 in celebration of the canonization of Blessed Brother André Bessette. Pope Benedict XVI recently announced that Blessed Brother André will be formally declared a saint at a ceremony in Saint Peter's Square on October 17, 2010. The pilgrimage will be organized by Canterbury Tours of Bedford, NH. It will also include visits to other Italian holy sites in Rome, Assisi, and Siena.

Rooted in his devotion to St. Joseph, and motivated by his compassion, Brother André Bessette dedicated his life to comforting those in greatest need. During his lifetime he became popularly known for encouraging the sick and infirm to pray to St. Joseph to intervene on their behalf. Many claimed they were cured thanks to these prayers. Brother André died in 1937, at the age of 91.

Many New Hampshire Catholics, particularly those of French Canadian descent have taken pilgrimages to Saint Joseph's Oratory in Montreal, a shrine built under the guidance of Brother André beginning in 1904 and continuing after his death until its completion in 1967. Today, it is the most popular shrine to St. Joseph in the world.

Bishop McCormack said, "Brother André was a holy man whose love of God and devotion to St. Joseph, our own diocese's patron saint, continues to be an inspiration to millions of people. In reflecting on him, Pope John Paul II said, 'In each age the Holy Spirit raises up such humble witnesses of the Gospel.' RECIPE FOR LENT FROM BISHOP MCCORMACK

Broiled Haddock basted with butter, drizzled with lemon juice, broiled on top shelf for 7 minutes, topped with crushed Ritz crackers, butter poured over the crackers, broil for one minute and serve with spinach and baked sweet potato.

1 lb. white fish (sole, haddock, cod),
Pinch parsley, pepper & salt to taste

8-10 crushed Ritz crackers
Sprinkle Parmesan cheese

1/4 stick butter, melted

Put fish in greased baking dish. Sprinkle with buttered crumbs and seasonings. Bake at 375 degrees until fish flakes, about 20 minutes. Serves 4.

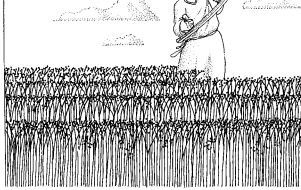
CHURCH RENOVATION FUND
