# Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time June 12-13, 2010

I live, no longer I, but Christ lives in me. — *Galatians*



## REPENT

“You are the man.” These words, spoken to king David by the prophet Nathan in the passage just before today’s first reading, were a wake-up call to David that he had done wrong in taking the wife of Uriah and having Uriah killed in battle. The story that woke David up to his own guilt was about a rich man who had many sheep, but took and slaughtered the only sheep of a poor man. David thought the man should be punished, but when Nathan made known to him that this story was about David himself, David woke up to his own sin and repented, and the Lord forgave him.

Today’s psalm of David reinforces for us the necessity of recognizing our own guilt and confessing it before the Lord. Then “blessed is the one whose fault is taken away, / whose sin is covered” (Psalm 32:1). God becomes our shelter, and gives us back our freedom.

## TODAY’S READINGS

**First Reading** — The LORD forgives David for taking the wife of Uriah, and for having Uriah killed (2 Samuel 12:7-10, 13).

**Psalm** — Lord, forgive the wrong I have done (Psalm 32).

**Second Reading** — If justification comes through the law, then Christ died for nothing (Galatians 2:16, 19-21).

**Gospel** — Jesus forgives the woman because of her great love (Luke 7:36 — 8:3 [7:36-50]).

## SAINT ROMUALD (c. 951-102 June 19

“God so loved the world,” declares John 3:16. “Do not love the world,” warns 1 John 2:15. The “world” to love: this planet, entrusted to our stewardship, and its people, God’s children all. The “world” to flee: “sensual lust, enticement for the eyes, and a pretentious life” (1 John 2:16). Born in nobility, Romuald’s conversion followed the shock of witnessing his father murder an enemy. Renouncing his privileged world, Romuald sought God’s world in monastic life. Its winding turns and several dead ends make Romuald’s journey resonate with all who find life more maze than superhighway. Both the hermit’s solitary struggle and community life’s unique challenges shaped Romuald’s legacy: his vast Camaldolese Benedictine family of monks, nuns, and lay associates who, these thousand years later, from the mountain solitude of Camaldoli, Italy to an urban monastery in Berkeley, California—in Asia, Africa, South America, Europe—integrate Romuald’s experience into their witness of solitary prayer, communal charity and worship, and promotion of contemplative spirituality in this world that can so easily distract us from the God who loves it still.

## **What Can Help Me Better Discern A Call To The Priesthood?**

The call to priesthood comes from Christ and his Church. It is always discerned through a relationship with Christ and the Church through prayer and service. Some of the things you can do are to attend daily Mass more frequently, spend an hour in front of the Eucharist at least once a week if not more, and become involved in pastoral ministry in your parish.

If you are in high school this should be done through the youth ministry program in your parish. For those out of high school, speak with your pastor about becoming involved in ministry in your parish. Finally, to understand how the Lord is speaking to us, it is always helpful to seek out the guidance of a spiritual director. It is best to first talk with your pastor. He can offer support and help you in your discernment.

### **Q. Do I have to decide before I go to the seminary?**

A. Actually, no! The seminary is the place to discern a vocation. If you feel God may be calling you to be a priest, then the seminary is the best place to discern this call further. The seminary is designed to provide the optimal environment to hear the Lord's voice. The seminary formation program will challenge you to consider the Lord's call at all levels of your life; intellectual, psychological, physical, emotional and spiritual.

The seminary staff as well as the diocesan vocation director accompanies you in your discernment. They have been specially trained to work with young men who are considering a call to the priesthood. Not all those who enter seminary decide to become priest. This does not mean they have failed. Rather, they realized they are being called to another way of life. Their time in the seminary is of great benefit, because their education will be a valuable asset to them as well as the Church as they continue to live out their faith as baptized Christians.

### **Q. How do you discern a call to the priesthood?**

A. Discernment is a process of prayer, consultation, decision-making, and action. The Lord lives at the center of our beings, and his Spirit directly communicates to us his will. Discernment is the process whereby we become attuned to listening to God's voice speaking inside of us, and over time

seeking to do only God's will. Discernment works for us only when we believe that God does speak within us, and then when I trust in what he says to him, and finally I desire to do only what God wants.

### **Q. What then are the steps to discernment of a vocation?**

A. There are different methods to discernment, but they would all include the following elements:

**Prayer** — God speaks to us in the context of our prayer

**Listening** — We have to spend time in quiet to be able to listen to God's voice. Sometimes God may speak to us slowly over time, while for others God may speak all at once. In any case it takes time to grow accustomed to listening to the way God speaks. We should also listen to people around us. Sometimes God speaks through others, and if others have noted in us a priestly vocation, we should pay attention to this and let it be a part of our discernment.

**Information** — We need to seek information about the diocesan priesthood. This can come from our pastor, youth director, parents, or the vocation director. You can also visit the seminary. The diocesan Vocation Office sponsors trips to the seminary each year.

**Decision-Making** — A vocation just doesn't happen to us! We just don't fall in love! We make decisions about what we are going to do with our life. It is important to make a decision about what our discernment is telling us, and this will mean that we have to take a risk with our God!

**Action** — once we have made our decision we have to take appropriate action. This is when we begin the process of applying for admission to the diocese.

**Spiritual Direction** — It is important to have a spiritual director to help us during this process of discernment. Perhaps the first person we should speak to is our Pastor. He is our shepherd in our parish, and he can direct us as to where we need to go.

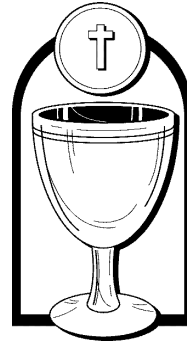

## **EUCARISTIC ADORATION**

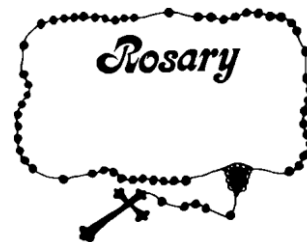


*"The act of adoration outside of Mass prolongs and intensifies all that takes place during the liturgical celebration itself." – Benedict XVI*
