This is from the Bible book of Isaiah, chapter 25:

For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways," says the Lord. "For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts.

What would Mac Sledge think about this?

Things to watch for:

- Mac's nickname for his daughter
- The name of the motel

While Rosa Lee is waiting for Mac to come back home, she prays part of Psalm 25 from the Bible:

Remember, O Lord, thy tender mercies and thy loving kindnesses; for they have been ever of old.
